

How Best Ball Works

Each team member must hit 4 drives per 18 holes and they must be marked on the score card.

Any player can use his/her drive for prizes, even if it's not used for scoring.

Example: One a Line Drive Hole, Player #1 hits a 100 yard drive and is closest to the line. Player #2 hits a 250 yard drive not close to the line. Player #1 can set the line drive marker at his/her lie for the prize and the team can still play from Player #2's lie for scoring.

After selection of drive, all team members must hit from that position.

- 1. Each team member may place his/her ball within 6" of the selected shot but not nearer to the hole. If the lie is in a hazard, trap, out-of-bounds or water, you are not allowed to use the 6" to move out of the hazard.
- 2. Each team member may improve his/her lie by placing by hand or by moving it with club head. The ball is in play once the player has addressed the ball.
- 3. When putting, the designated ball must be marked (tee marker) no nearer to the hole. Once a ball is holed out, non further strokes are permitted.

Mulligans may not be used for Hole-In-One holes, prize holes (Line Drive, Longest Drive, or Closest to Pin).

Prize Rules

Longest Drive Must be in the fairway (no rough).

Marker is placed on the furthest drive.

Mulligan may not be used.

Line Drive Player's lie is closest to the line regardless of distance.

If two players have lies the same distance from the line, marker

should be placed on the furthest from the tee.

Mulligan may not be used.

Hole-in-One(s) All players get one (1) shot only.

Mulligan may not be used.

Closest to Pin Mulligan may not be used.
