Tournament Safety Plan

Restrictions and guidelines for golfing in Washington state have been eased to allow golfers to play while keeping social distance and health precautions a top priority. As there are still some restrictions in place for large gatherings, below is our safety plan for a secure and healthy environment for all participants at our tournament. Please read and remember that compliance of these rules is what makes the tournament a safe yet fun event for all.

Online Registration

- ✓ Register online and get all your information prior to the tournament.
- ✓ Download/print the rules, scoring and prize list to decrease the need to give handouts thereby creating an unnecessary touch point.
- ✓ Buy mulligans online to decrease the handling of credit cards or cash on the day of the tournament. (\$5 per mulligan, maximum 2 mulligans per player)
- ✓ Sign the liability waiver online.

Check-In Process

- ✓ Shotgun starts are unavailable due to distancing requirements. We will be doing assigned tee times beginning at 8am to approximately 12pm.
- ✓ To avoid congestion and long lines, golfers will be assigned a check-in time so that there is a staggered ingress.
- ✓ If you ordered a cart directly with Mt Si, you will be provided with sanitizing wipes to wipe it down.
- ✓ Last minute sales of mulligans will be available for purchase however, we recommend pre-buying it online to lessen touch points and go to a no-touch check-in.

Code of Conduct for Social Distancing

- ✓ Players must wear a face mask for the entire duration of the tournament as mandated by the state.
- ✓ Players are not to touch or remove the flagstick for any reason. Mount Si uses a raised ball cup to lessen touchpoints.
- ✓ Players are not to stand or walk within 6 feet of one another during the tournament as much as possible.
- ✓ Players should not share any equipment (towels, tees, balls, etc.) during the tournament.
- ✓ Players are not to touch another competitor's equipment during the tournament.
- ✓ After playing a shot from inside a bunker, players are required to smooth the area to the best of their ability using a foot or a golf club. Bunker rakes will not be available.
- ✓ There cannot be more than 5 people allowed in one location so this will limit activity at each hole. If each team consists of 4 players, then only 1 additional person (a spawnsor or non-profit representative) will be allowed.
- ✓ Hand sanitizer will be provided at each hole for your protection.

Food, Beverages & Banquet

- ✓ There will not be a sit down banquet/lunch after the tournament due to the wide range of assigned beginning tee times and social distancing rules.
- ✓ All lunches will be a grab-and-go boxed lunch.
- ✓ You may pick up your lunch before, during or after your round of golf.
- ✓ Mt Si will have a beverage cart making the rounds around the holes. They follow strict protocol for your safety.

Mt Si Social Distancing Rules

Mt Si is committed to the safety of their patrons and employees. Their facilities are frequently cleaned, and they disinfect all high-touch areas as recommended by the CDC and all other applicable health recommendations.

Golf Course

- ✓ Paired cart riders must wear face masks.
- ✓ Touch points on the golf course such as air stations, rakes, etc. have been removed.
- ✓ The flagstick must always remain in.
- ✓ There is no restroom on the back 9. There are flush bathrooms on holes #8 and #10, but the sanitation near #14 is closed due to Covid safety.

Pro Shop

- ✓ The Pro Shop door is closed, so cart rentals must be obtained through the two windows located on the 1st tee. If you need merchandise (i.e. tees, balls, etc.) you may purchase them at the window.
- ✓ People must maintain a 6-foot distance while waiting in line.
- ✓ Pushcart rentals are available but no rental clubs.
- ✓ All payment types are accepted.

Restaurant

- ✓ Opens at 7am and operates at 50% capacity. No gathering of more than 8 people is allowed anywhere and 4 per table in restaurant and outside area if open.

Driving Range & Putting Green

- ✓ Open to all.

Scorecards and Scoring

- ✓ Scorecard and tournament rules will be emailed out prior to the tournament/are available online during registration and should be used as your official card (If for some reason you do not get a card, then use one from the course and enter name and gross scores.). Gross scores must be entered for each hole.
- ✓ To minimize touch points, we recommend that each team designate one score keeper and that person keeps track of everyone's score. This will help prevent sharing of pens/pencils. In order to minimize touch points, you do not need to sign the playing partner's card. It is implied that the other card was attested.
- ✓ Turn in your completed and signed scorecards to the Registration table located in restaurant.

- ✓ **Scores will not be posted.** We will email the winning teams and contest winners by Friday, May 21st.

Good Ideas & Recommendations

- ✓ Pre-mark your golf balls/use specific colored balls for easy identification without having to pick up other players' golf balls.
- ✓ We are implementing a no handshake policy at the tournament. We encourage golfers to do elbow or even foot bumps to celebrate instead of high fives or handshakes for all greetings and celebratory events.
- ✓ Communication is key. We realize that there is a higher than normal chance that at the last minute, you or a loved one may get sick, exposed to someone who is sick, or are listed in the CDC's high-risk category. If you feel you are compromised in any way prior to and/or during the tournament, please let us know. Your health and safety are a priority and we take all concerns seriously.
- ✓ We prioritize everyone's well-being. If you feel in any way unsafe or uncomfortable at any time, please call immediately & let us know so we may come up with a viable solution if one is needed.

Volunteers & Staff

- ✓ All volunteers and staff will be required to go through a wellness check before their shift. They will answer a quick set of health questions about symptoms and close-contact exposures, and be issued a mask and set of gloves (if needed).
